- Collection will be conducted according to the calendar below on public holidays and during the New Year holidays.
- **Waste generated by businesses cannot be disposed of at garbage stations or Clean Station Nasu.**
(Restaurants, inns, guesthouses, pensions, etc.)

Delivery reception hours: 8:30am - 11:30am 1:00pm - 4:30pm (weekdays)
9:00am - 12:00pm (2nd and 4th Sundays)
※ However, large items cannot be brought in on the second and fourth Sundays of each month.
Facility closed days: Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays, and December 29th to January 3rd other than the above.

How to separate and put out garbage

- Items that cannot be put into designated garbage bags and have the tops of the bags tied up will be considered bulky garbage .(fees apply)

Recycleable	Burnable garbage	Plastic containers and packaging(waste plastic)	Used small household appliances
<p>Tie them crosswise with string according to type.</p> <p>Even if you only put out one, please tie it with string.</p> <p>Newspapers(including inserts)</p> <p>○ Thin booklets should be classified as "Magazines and other paper."</p> <p>Cardboard</p> <p>○ Only those with corrugated edges are accepted.</p> <p>○ Remove as much adhesive tape, fasteners, etc. as possible.</p> <p>Paper pack</p> <p>○ Only items with a white interior(Not aluminum coated) are eligible. Anything else should be disposed of as "burnable garbage".</p> <p>○ Rinse, cut open and dry.</p> <p>Magazines and other papers</p> <p>○ Paper boxes such as tissue boxes should be crushed before disposal.</p> <p>○ Remove everything except the paper.</p> <p>○ Place small papers(postcards, envelopes, etc.) in a paper bag and tie it with string to prevent them from scattering.</p>	<p>Can(Limited to beverages and food)</p> <p>○ Caps and lids are "Non-burnable garbage" .</p> <p>○ Do not crush them so they can be recycled.</p> <p>By type transparent bag (45.L or less) grocery bags not allowed</p> <p>Bottles(For beverages and food only)</p> <p>○ Crowns, caps, and broken items are non-burnable waste.</p> <p>○ If possible, have retailers take back 1.8L bottles and beer bottles.</p> <p>Plastic bottle</p> <p>○ Only items with a recycling mark are accepted.</p> <p>○ Labels and caps go under "Plastic containers and packaging".</p> <p>○ Oil bottles go on in the "burnable waste" category.</p> <p>○ Water server bottles should be disposed of as burnable waste.</p> <p>○ Do not crush so that can be recycled.</p> <p>White tray</p> <p>○ A white polystyrene foam plate for food . (Fresh fish, meat, prepared foods, vegetables)</p> <p>○ Food trays other than white should be classified as "Plastic containers and packaging".</p> <p>Designated garbage bags (yellow)</p> <p>Food waste, clothing, waste paper, etc.</p> <p>○ Drain food waste thoroughly before disposing of it.</p> <p>○ Remove metal fittings from clothing, shoes, bags, etc. before putting them out.</p> <p>○ Skewers and other sharp objects can cause injury, so they should be broken or wrapped before disposed of.</p> <p>Designated garbage bags (green)</p> <p>Glass, ceramics, metals</p> <p>○ Spray cans and stove gas cylinders should only be disposed of after the contents have been completely used up.</p> <p>○ Broken glass, knives, etc. should be wrapped in paper and labeled "ケケン".</p> <p>Hazardous waste</p> <p>(F luorescent tubes, dry cell batteries, mercury thermometers.)</p> <p>○ F luorescent tube s wrap it in paper and write "ケケン!" on it. (You can also put it in the box of the replaced fluorescent tube.)</p> <p>○ Dry batteries(manganese, alkaline), button batteries, coinbatteries, small rechargeable batteries, mobile battelies, electronic cigarettes.</p> <p>For button batteries, coin batteries, and rechargeable batteries. with exposed terminals, insulate the terminals by applying tape, etc.</p>	<p>The items to be collected are marked with the plastic symbol. Outer packaging for sweets, containers for bentoboxes and side dishes, caps and labels for plastic bottles, tofu and egg cartons, colored food trays, etc.</p> <p>○ If there is any dirt or residue, wash it off with water before disposal. If the dirt cannot be removed, dispose of it as "burnable garbage."</p> <p>○ Do not chop it up into small pieces.</p> <p>※ Since plastic products cannot be collected as plastic containers and packaging, they should be disposed of as "burnable waste."</p> <p>(Examples include plastic spoons, straws, clearfiles, hangers, buckets, etc.)</p> <p>Plastic products such as plastic spoons and straws are considered "burnable garbage."</p> <p>Bulky garbage(Cannot be disposed of at garbage collection points)</p> <p>There are three disposal methods:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▶ Bring it directly to the Clean Station Nasu or the Otawara Regional Clean Center. ▶ Request a pick-up from a town general waste disposal company. ▶ Request door-to-door collection.(Application required) <p>Door-to-door collection Application/Inquiry Clean Station Nasu ☎0287-74-0420</p>	<p>Applicable items</p> <p>Items that run on electricity or batteries and fit into the collection box's slot (60cm×30cm).</p> <p>Collection box installation location</p> <p>Town hall main building, each branch office, cultural center, Yume Plaza Nasu, Yuai no mori, Clean Station Nasu</p> <p>Example of items</p> <p>Mobile phones, digital cameras, DVD player, USB memorysticks, calculators, hair dryers, watches, game consoles, accessories for small home appliances, etc.</p> <p>Computer Mobile phone Dryer Flashlight</p> <p>Items that are not considered used small home appliances.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Television, air conditioner, refrigerator, washing machine, clothes dryer. →As this item is subject to the Home Appliance Recycling Law, you will need to purchase a recycling ticket at the post office. ○ Items that become bulky garbage. ・ Large home appliances.(massage chairs, running machines, etc.) ・ Wooden products.(speakers, kotatsu, organs, etc.) ○ Equipment that uses fluorocarbons. (dehumidifiers, etc.)→Consult with the store
